The occupants refuse to pay the £9.00. This results in Male B being assaulted by 3 males at the address and his phone being stolen. Male A is also assaulted by one of the males.

Male A runs from the scene as he is scared for his safely leaving his car and keys in the ignition at Warberry Vale. Male B then gets in his car and drives from the scene. One of the suspects enters Male A's car and chases Male B. Male B drives into town in order to flag down a Police Officer, which he was unable to do.

The driver of Male A's vehicle then runs from the scene.
