<p><b>Question (1) by Councillor Carter to the Executive Lead for Adults and Children's Services (Councillor Parrott)</b></p>	<p><b>When did the council last conduct any monitoring and on the spot checking of child work permits in Torbay?</b></p>
<p><b>Question (2) by Councillor Darling (S) to the Mayor and Executive Lead for Finance, Regeneration and Corporate Services (Mayor Oliver)</b></p>	<p><b>Can you please advise me on a year by year basis over the past five years, the number of apprenticeships offered to our community by Torbay Council and how many of them were taken up by looked after children under the care of this or another authority?</b></p>
<p><b>Question (3) by Councillor Doggett to the Executive Lead for Planning, Transport and Housing (Councillor King)</b></p>	<p><b>Campaign for Better Transport conducted some research into the levels of subsidy of bus services across the South West of England. Their concern was raised by the Grenfell fire in Kensington, London.</b></p> <p><b>Whilst I appreciate we have a small number of tower blocks in Torbay we do have a significant number of houses in multiple occupation. Can you advise what additional fire safety checks have occurred within such properties in Torbay?</b></p>
